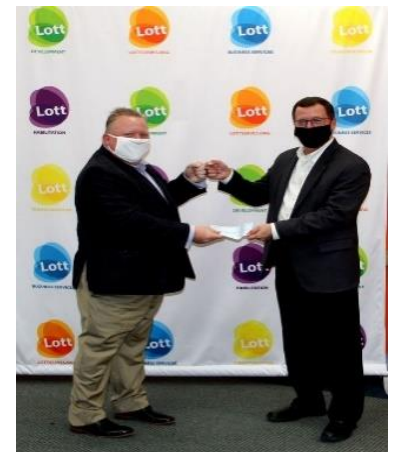
65 YEARS AND COUNTING!!!
